AMENDED ENDORSEMENT

Honourable Harry Slade, Chairperson

A Case Management Conference (CMC) was held in person on June 30, 2015, at 9:54 A.M., Vancouver.

[1] The Claimant shall serve the Respondent with its expert report, prepared by Rod Cook, on or before **July 8, 2015**.

[2] The Claimant shall advise the Respondent no later than **July 10, 2015**, if they intend to respond to the Martin and Schmidt Expert Reports. If the Claimant states they will respond, they must provide the Respondent with a date on which they will serve those reports. The Parties shall advise the Tribunal if a CMC is required.

[3] The Respondent shall file its responsive report to the Cook expert report on or before **September 15, 2015**.

[4] A pre-hearing conference for the hearing scheduled for October 12-23, 2015 will be held on Friday, **September 18, 2015**, jointly with the *Skuppah Indian Band v. HMQ*, SCT-7004-13, in person in Vancouver, if possible. By this time, the Parties are to know the dates on which each witness and expert will be testifying. Priority is to be given to the experts.

[5] The Claimant shall file its supplementary expert report on or before **September 30, 2015**.

[6] The Parties will advise the Tribunal if they require a CMC to resolve any issues related to exchanged Will-Says and Will-Asks.

[7] The October hearing will include oral history and the examination of experts. The Parties shall discuss and advise the Tribunal as to a shared hearing venue for the examination of the experts, and what evidence will be heard at which venue. Oral history will be heard in the Siska and Skuppah communities respectively.

[8] The Parties shall discuss with their respective clients whether the oral history and expert testimony should be video recorded if by the end of September Justice Slade has not been appointed to the Tribunal for a further term.
