



[1] **PURSUANT TO** Rules (R.) 34 and 45 of the *Specific Claims Tribunal Rules of Practice and Procedure* (the *Rules*), an Application for Leave to Intervene (the “Application”) was filed on October 27, 2014, by the Claimant’s Counsel, Ms. Leah Pence, on behalf of the Boothroyd First Nation, the Lytton First Nation and the Spuzzum First Nation acting collectively through the Nlaka’pamux Nation Tribal Council (the “Applicant”).

[2] The Respondent consents to the Application for intervenor status in its Response to the Application filed November 20, 2014, pursuant to R. 35 of the *Rules*, and further set out the terms to which the Parties have consented intervention ought to occur, pursuant to the Parties' ability to make submissions regarding possible directions under R. 46 of the *Rules*. Such terms are that the Applicant:

- a) may file a written memorandum that does not duplicate the Parties' submissions;
- b) may make oral submissions;
- c) will not add to the evidentiary record, and, for greater certainty, written memoranda and oral submissions will be limited to the evidentiary record before the Tribunal in this Claim, and to the issues set out in the Declaration of Claim, the Response, and as further agreed to by the Parties;
- d) will not present, examine, or cross-examine witnesses;
- e) will have no right to judicially review any order in this proceeding; and,
- f) will have no right to seek costs against the Parties for any part of this proceeding.

[3] The Claimant and Applicant, by their Counsel, agree to the terms above, as evidenced by their consent in writing, attached to the Respondent’s Response to the Application.

**THE TRIBUNAL ORDERS THAT:**

[4] The Boothroyd First Nation, Lytton First Nation and Spuzzum First Nation acting collectively through the Nlaka’pamux Nation Tribal Council, identified in the style of cause is now deemed an Intervenor in the Claim *Skuppah Indian Band v Her Majesty the Queen in Right*

*of Canada (as represented by the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development), in the Tribunal file number SCT-7004-13.*
