ENDORSEMENT

Honourable W.L. Whalen

A Case Management Conference (CMC) was held by teleconference on August 18, 2014, at 11:00 A.M., Eastern Time (Ottawa).

[1] The Claimant reported that its Expert had not been able to complete the awaited report on the categorization of expenses but that the report was expected to be ready in early September 2014 when a copy would also be delivered to the Respondent. Yesterday's CMC had been

scheduled in anticipation of the report having been completed and delivered so that final decisions could be taken on the completion of an Agreed Statement of Facts and Common Book of Documents. The Respondent has also not taken a decision on the admissibility of the Seven Oaks Report. The Parties' positions on these matters should be ready for presentation and discussion at the next CMC.

[2] The Parties consented to an order bifurcating the Claim into two phases: the first to determine the validity and base value of any loss found; the second to bring forward any such loss found if there was one. However, subsequent to yesterday's CMC, Justice Mainville's written Reasons of June 26, 2013, denying bifurcation were brought to my attention. The question of bifurcation is adjourned to the next CMC for further consideration.

[3] The next CMC will take place by teleconference on Tuesday, October 14, 2014 at 11:30 A.M., Eastern Time (Ottawa).
