ENDORSEMENT

Honourable W.L. Whalen

A Case Management Conference (CMC) was held by teleconference on January 28, at 2:00 P.M., Eastern Time (Ottawa).

[1] The Joan Holmes & Associates Report in respect of trust records and other financial information was completed and delivered to the Parties in December 2014. The Claimant has provided a copy of it to its “bring forward” expert whose report should be completed on or by **May 31, 2015**, provided that the Claimant and its expert receive the Respondent’s historical land value expert report by the end of February 2015.

[2] The Respondent is assembling the underlying financial material for the Joan Holmes & Associates Report and expects to deliver that material along with that Report to its “bring forward” expert in early February 2015. The Respondent’s historical value expert has received a copy of the Claimant’s historical value expert report and is expected to have his report finished by mid-February 2015 for production to the Respondent by the end of February 2015.

[3] The Parties agree that the hearing should be divided into two parts. The first part is expected to require 5 days to receive the evidence of the experts in respect of historical value, “bring forward” methodology and result. The second part would follow about 6 weeks later for the legal submissions and will require 2 to 3 days. The Parties anticipate obtaining transcripts of the proceedings in the first part of the hearing process (in aid of preparing submissions), which should require about 2 weeks.

[4] The Intervenor will be advised of all CMCs but will not be required to file CMC briefs.

[5] A CMC will be held by teleconference on **June 5, 2015**, at 11:30 A.M. Eastern Time (Ottawa) to canvass the progress of expert reports and to set dates for both parts of the hearing, which will be held in Vancouver at the Canadian Industrial Relations Board, located at 300 West Georgia Street.
